MYTH: IMMIGRANTS TAKE JOBS FROM BORN-CANADIAN

A common myth heard by those who are anti-immigration is that immigrants are taking jobs and opportunities from those who were born in Canada.

Not only is this untrue, the opposite is actually the case!

ENTREPRENEURS

Immigrant entrepreneurs account for 25% of jobs created, while only accounting for 16% of the population.



MORE JOBS CREATED

Over the 11-year period, immigrantowned firms tended to create more net new jobs on average (0.28) on a per-firm basis than firms with Canadian-born owners (0.16).



If Canada didn't accept immigrants, the population would shrink due to the low birthrate. In the 1970s Canada's birthrate dropped below the threshold needed to maintain a

Having an ally in navigating the transition into life and work in Canada is so important for increasing health and happiness for the individual and their families. It also fills my heart too.♥"


