Cities of Migration and Pathways to Prosperity Community Consulation


Various stakeholders and local experts listened to the presentation from Cities of Migration. At the beginning of March, the Immigration Partnership facilitated a combined Brockville community consultation with Cities of Migration and Pathways to Prosperity, two internationally renowned organizations researching immigration and community

population, and local labor market challenges. The various stakeholders, local experts, and service providers answered questions around what attracts and retains immigrants to the area, what barriers exist, and what can be done to improve local attraction and retention efforts. Presentations from both organizations highlighted their research focuses and their end-goals. The reports and toolkits created from this research will be shared with the Immigration Partnership and partners once completed.






